

**SUMMARY REPORT
OF COUNCIL ACTION TAKEN AT THE MAY 11, 2010 WORK SESSION**

This summary is a statement of legal actions taken by the Cottonwood City Council at a regular meeting pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02(D), and is being provided as required by A.R.S. § 38-431.01(D.).

Council Members Present: Mayor Joens, Council Members Tim Elinski, Duane Kirby, Linda Norman, and Darold Smith. **Council Members Absent:** Vice Mayor Karen Pfeifer, Council Member Terence Pratt.

Mayor Joens called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION TO STAFF:

PRESENTATION ON THE SECOND PHASE OF A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR A RIVERFRONT PARK WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY

Mr. Ken Knickerbocker, Vice President of consultants Coe & Van Loo, presented facts and figures for consideration by the Council pertaining to locating a water reclamation facility in Riverfront Park. These were in more detail and updated since 2008 when the Council first discussed this issue.

Ms. Kathleen Fitzpatrick, of Coe & Van Loo, discussed solar power options for the reclamation facility. She covered costs and savings, grants, and tax incentives available.

The Council's direction was for staff to move forward with the project and to prepare a scope of work for the Council's consideration.

PROPOSED ADOPTION OF THE 2009 BUILDING AND FIRE CODES

The Council heard from staff regarding the desirability of adopting updated building and fire codes. While most of the changes from the existing codes were minor housekeeping matters, the new fire code would require new manufactured homes, or those re-located into the city that did not have a sprinkler system, to have built in sprinkler systems similar to those required for other residential units.

The Council's direction to staff was to move forward with preparation of an ordinance to implement these changes.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO MUNICIPAL CODE MANDATING ALL PSEUDOEPHEDRINE PRODUCTS BE MADE AVAILABLE BY PRESCRIPTION ONLY

Mr. Bartosh stated this item had been withdrawn after legal inquiries had determined it was contrary to state statute.

The Council's direction to staff was to prepare a resolution for the Arizona League of Cities &

Towns and members of the State Legislature requesting them to support legislation at the state level which would require all pseudoephedrine products be made available by prescription only.
