

The Arizona Small Business Association (ASBA) will offer Verde Valley employers the new Healthy Arizona Worksites Program (HAWP) training, free of charge.

The HAWP training is split into two sessions: one half-day session, and (six weeks later) one full-day session. The first session is scheduled for:

The program is designed for “small businesses,” and can benefit employers of a couple of employees on up to 2000 plus. Ideally, organizational leaders and/or H.R. professionals will participate on behalf of their business.

Participating organizations learn about comprehensive worksite wellness programs, and how they: reduce costs associated with health care and absenteeism, increase employee productivity, and can realize up to a \$6 return for every \$1 invested.

By participating, area employers will receive a worksite wellness assessment tool, ongoing technical support from the ASBA, as well as recognition as a “Healthy Arizona Worksite” by the Arizona Department of Health Services.

Space is limited. This training is being offered free of charge thanks to a partnership with Yavapai County Community Health Services and the Arizona Department of Health Services.
