Super Extreme DUI:

On Friday evening, 41 year old Cornville resident Christopher Carey was arrested for Super Extreme DUI after it was discovered he had a BAC of .257%. Carey had been involved in an altercation in the 1000 block of N. 4th Street but fled the area in his vehicle when Police began arriving on scene. A Cottonwood Officer observed Carey driving in the area of N. 1st Street and E. Pinal where Carey pulled into a public parking lot and opened his door. As the Officer approached Carey he observed Carey was on his cell phone, "Crying and yelling". After repeated commands from the officer to hang up the call and exit the vehicle Carey complied and stumbled out of the truck. As the officer attempted to speak to Carey he observed Carey to have bloodshot watery eyes, slurred speech, and a strong smell of an intoxicating beverage emitting from Carey. According to the officer's report, Carey was crying and difficult to understand. Carey was seated on the curb for his safety but had a hard time sitting up. During the Field Sobriety Tests, Carey was unable to follow directions, was crying hysterically, and yelling at the officers. The tests were ceased for Carey's safety and Carey was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI where, after giving a breath sample, registered a BAC of .257%. Carey was cited and released to a responsible party.

Theft of a decorative cattle skull:

During the late evening on Friday, or early morning hours on Saturday, and unknown person or persons stole a decorative cattle skull worth approximately \$100.00, from a home in the 200 block of Desperado in Cottonwood Ranch. The skull was part of the landscaping of the residence. According to the officers report it is not believed the skull was removed by animals but rather that it had been stolen by someone. At this time there are no further leads.
